

KEEP ON THE SUNNY SIDE

"The Eye of a Needle: A Childhood Recollection"

['Reframed' from an earlier column.]

"Again I tell you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." [Matthew 19:24, NIV]

As a child brought up in the church, and whose mother and grandmother were quilters, embroidery and crochet artists; AND, seamstresses who made many of my clothes, I associated the "eye of the needle"—not with the difficulties of "someone who is rich"; (I did not know anyone who was rich.); but, with the frustrations I experienced "first hand" attempting to thread the embroidery needle. And, I confess, I found it difficult to "thread ANY needle" whether it was a quilting, embroidery, or sewing machine needle. I failed completely at the "art of threading a needle." (My younger sister inherited all the sewing talents (or patience) in my generation. J I was happy for her.)

However, even as a child, I knew a camel could never get through the "eye of a needle." (It was obvious that the camel was too BIG!) So, I did my very best to learn the "techniques" of threading the small "eye of the needle," SO I could use the vibrant-colored threads to stitch the embroidery pattern. I actually loved selecting the colors and matching them to the stamped design on the embroidery cloth. Fortunately, I developed the patience to persist and accomplished the "art" of threading the needle. Practice at threading the needle taught me that when the instructions called for more "strands" of thread, I would need to be more patient with MY-SELF when "guiding" the thread through the eye of the needle.

And, yes, "Alice and Dorothy" in our lives, we are going to encounter situations that are difficult to either change or accept. And, sometimes it takes more time to overcome obstacles when we have more threads to navigate through the needle of life. And, yes the Holy Word does use similes, metaphors, and hyperboles to get our attention. Anyone ever see "a camel go through the eye of a needle?"

Much OLDER now, I am grateful for my youthful attempts learning how to "thread the needle" because my valiant efforts taught me both persistence and gave me the ability to recognize that not everyone has the same talents. My inability to thread the needle led me to realize that there would be frustrations throughout my life requiring me to overcome obstacles in order to be successful. WISER now than when my mother and grandmother endeavored to teach me how to thread the embroidery needle, I now know not to become frustrated with new things I am learning to do in my community chaplaincy ministry; instead to recognize that God gives us all many talents (and colors) to "thread the eye of the needle" to accomplish our numerous tasks. Glory to God.



We have completed the HVAC air conditioning replacement. First UCC now has two separate HVAC systems to cool/heat the Fellowship Hall and to cool the Church Sanctuary.
