

# When Jesus Calls: You Answer

In the Gospel of Matthew 4:18-22 (NIV) Jesus called his first four disciples. They were fishermen; and, working on their boats, when Jesus called to them. Jesus instructed Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew to: "Come follow me, and I will make you "fish for people" (v. 19). Immediately, they "left their nets and followed Jesus (v.20). Jesus now accompanied by Simon Peter and Andrew, walk on. Jesus calls to two other brothers, James and John preparing their fishing nets in their boat along with their father, Zebedee. Immediately, they left their father in the boat to follow Jesus (v, 22).

I wonder how James' and John's father felt when he saw his sons get up and walk away with Jesus, Simon Peter, and Andrew. Did they say farewell to their father? The reader is not told. The Gospel's focus is not on describing how the father felt; but, on the immediate decision of his two sons not to hesitate to accompany Jesus. No questions. I don't know about you, but I don't think they left because they were having a bad day, were bored with their jobs, or perhaps thought "Oh, Why not? Let's go." We are not told. It is not the point of the story. The point is: they went to become "fishers of men" because Jesus called them.

As either readers or listeners of the Gospel, we learn that when Jesus called his disciples, they neither asked questions nor asked for time extensions like the man in the Gospel of Luke who told Jesus "I will follow you, Lord; but first let me go back and say goodbye to my family" (Luke 9:61, NIV).

No. When Jesus began his ministry HE called and the fishermen answered (non-verbally—just accepted Jesus "invitation" without any questions or excuses.) I believe they did not hesitate, ask questions, or requested time extensions because they were honored to be called because the Lord honored--selected them -- handpicked them, called them for a lifetime opportunity to serve the Lord. There was no blowing of the "shofar" ~a horn~ a ritual musical instrument, made from the horn of a ram or other animal, used on important Jewish public and religious occasions.

Many of us recall listening to the Gospel stories beginning after the Christmas Holidays when Jesus began his ministry by "calling" his disciples. In Sunday school and Confirmation classes, we learned about Jewish customs – including the shofar used to "call" the Israelites to enter the tent...the tabernacle to worship.

Listen for the sound of the shofar. God is calling you, calling all of us to make a difference in someone's life.



# SELF CARE WITH PASTOR RACHEL

# Self-Care is Self-Love 1 Corinthians 13: 1-13

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

Our scripture tells us that love should be first. Most importantly, we need to love ourselves first so w can better take care of others. Whether you have someone in your life to share this love, we still need to take time to honor ourselves. After all, think about when you are on an airplane, and the steward says, "when the oxygen mask drops down, put the mask over your mouth and nose first, before assisting someone else."

We have to be able to BREATHE to help someone else breathe through a difficult time or moment.

This exercise below can help us rediscover ourselves and our value. Stand in the mirror and say one or more of these affirmations out loud in the mirror every day. I have found these affirmations changed my own way of thinking about myself for the better.

Have a beautiful February. You are loved!

#### **Update on In-Person Services**

Based on the fact that Covid cases continue to decrease in our community, Consistory decided at its February 21, 2022 meeting that starting this Sunday, February 27, 2022, not only will we return to in-person services, but those who have been fully vaccinated and boosted have the option to unmask if they so desire. #### **Book Chat Update:**

Book Chat members have recently read The Diamond Eye by one of our favorite authors, Kate Quinn. Quinn has done her usual extensive research to create a riveting story of a young Russian mother who becomes a sniper in World War II. Mila dedicates her life and skill to weaken Hitler's troop-strength, by eradicating Nazi officers and troops, including other snipers. The characters develop intense relationships based on the circumstances that war creates.

The drama continues in the United States when the sniper, Mila, is invited to join a group of Russian guests at the White House, hosted by President and Mrs. Roosevelt. Roosevelt is hoping to inspire the US to help Russia in the war. Unbeknownst to the characters, but known to the reader, there is a sniper with falsified credentials among the press corps. Quinn gives us insights into his observations and thought processes, as he watches and waits for his opportunity to carry out the assignment for which he has been hired.

Next on our list is The Secret-Keeper of Jaipur by Alka Joshi. It is a sequel to The Henna Artist, which was also a Book Chat selection. We are excited to read more about the engaging array of diverse characters we met in The Henna Artist, such as henna artist Lakshimi, her younger sister Radha, and Lakshimi's ward Malik, a precocious young street boy, whom we enjoyed greatly in the preceeding novel.
